The Sustainability Report (ESG) was published for the first time for the year 2020, in compliance with international GRI Standards. With the participation of PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC), a methodology for calculating greenhouse gas emissions (Scope 1 + Scope 2) was developed and implemented at the production facilities of the Combine, including the copper production segment. PwC conducted an analysis of the Combine's ESG profile for compliance with international standards of best practices and responsible financing. The Combine obtained international certifications for the following management systems: ISO 50001:2018 – Energy Management System; ISO 14001:2015 – Environmental Management System; ISO 45001:2018 – Occupational Health and Safety Management System.  As part of the ongoing organizational and management reforms, a separate structural division (ESG Department) was established to ensure the effective organization of sustainable development activities.  In accordance with the Responsible Minerals Initiative (RMI) risk assessment criteria, an Action Plan was developed, and an Anti-Corruption and Ethics Committee was formed under the Supervisory Board. To monitor corruption-related risks, 18 internal regulatory documents were developed.  The Sustainability Report for 2023 was prepared independently. Greenhouse gas emissions (Scope 1 + Scope 2) were calculated, subjected to international audit, and received a positive auditor's opinion.  Corporate governance documents (policies, charters, codes, and regulations) were developed in accordance with international standards and approved by higher authorities.  To further enhance transparency, an ESG section was created on the Combine's official website. All sustainability-related reports and relevant internal documents are regularly published there.  On 18 February 2025, the international rating agency Sustainable Fitch assigned the Combine an ESG rating of level 3, with a score of 56 points—the highest among mining and metallurgical enterpris

JSC Almalyk MMC	In Progress. Within the framework of the "Yoshlik I" Mine Development Investment Project (Phase I, Stage 1), the following activities have been carried out:  1. Construction of the Third Copper Concentrating Plant (3-CCP). Construction works of the 3-CCP, under the condition of "commissioning on a turnkey basis," are being implemented by JSC Almalyk MMC jointly with the Uralmashzavod JSC and the Enter Engineering consortium.  The foreign company "Worley Parsons" has been engaged to carry out technical supervision of the construction process. At the construction site, 785.1 thousand cubic meters of concrete works and 109.7 thousand tons of reinforcement works have been completed; 40.4 thousand tons of technological equipment and 63.1 thousand tons of metal structures have been installed.  2. Delivery of Main Technological Equipment. Within the construction of the 3-CCP and the cyclic flow technology (CFT) system, all major technological equipment has been delivered, and installation and commissioning works are currently in progress.  3. Construction of Infrastructure Facilities for the 3-CCP. In the tailings storage facility (Map 1), 20.2 million cubic meters of earthworks have been completed for the dam foundation, and 11.3 thousand meters of pipelines have been laid.  At the construction site of the external water supply facilities, 109 km of water pipelines have been installed, along with 1.8 million cubic meters of earthworks, 3 thousand tons of reinforcement, and 19.3 thousand cubic meters of concrete works completed.  Currently, a total of 9,451 workers and 1,150 units of special equipment are engaged in the construction of the 3-CCP and its infrastructure facilities.  For reference:  According to the Minutes No. 75 (Appendix 6.1, Item 46) of the Cabinet of Ministers' Executive Board Meeting dated 28 June 2025, the Minutes No. 134 of the field meeting chaired by the Prime Minister of the Republic of Uzbekistan held on 29 July 2025, and the Minutes No. 18 of the Supervisory Board of JSC "Almalyk MMC" dated
